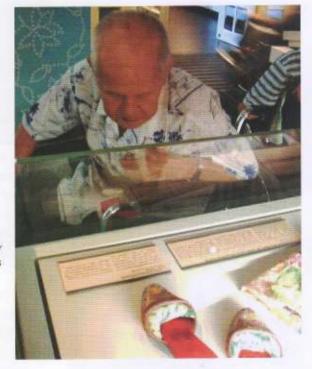

Therapy with Karaoke & Kopi



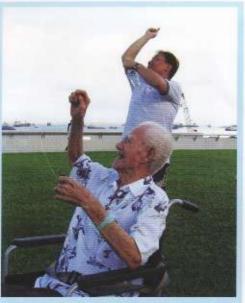

愈加硬朗的百岁老人



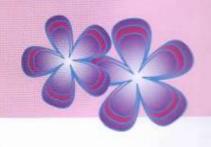
今年6月6日, 我们的一位病 患刘疏枝女士, 在这里喜迎了 她的100岁寿辰。

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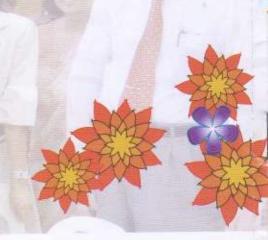

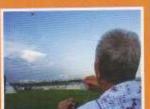
